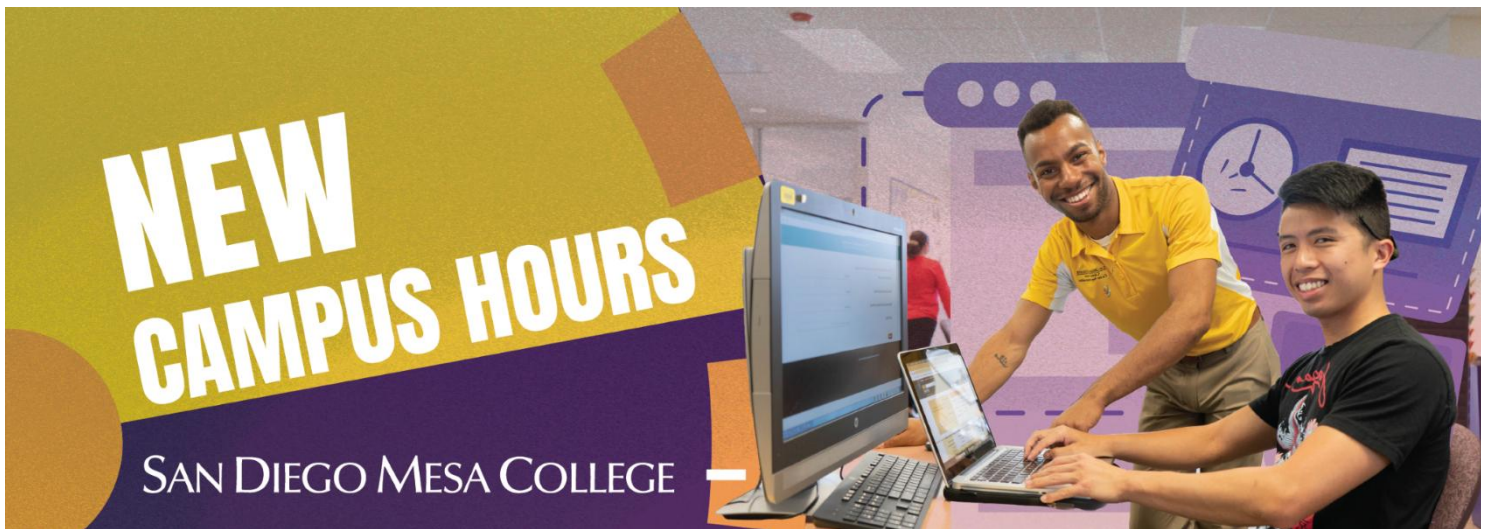

## Mesa College Accreditation Update: ACCJC Commission Meeting in January

The Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges will convene its January Commission meeting on January 14–15, 2026, at the Hyatt Regency Waikiki in Honolulu, Hawai'i. During this meeting cycle, the Commission will review San Diego Mesa College's 2025 Peer Review Team Report and take accreditation action in accordance with ACCJC policies and procedures. Following the Commission meeting and upon receipt of formal notification from ACCJC, I will share relevant outcomes and any next steps with the campus community, college constituencies, and governing board, as appropriate.



### **Spring 2026 Pilot: 36-Hour Workweek**

Beginning January 5 through April 3, the District will implement a pilot 36-hour workweek. Most campus and student service areas will follow a Monday to Thursday schedule, with offices closing at 1 p.m. on Fridays. Spring 2026 classes will meet as scheduled. This pilot is an opportunity to support employee well-being, strengthen service to students, and better understand how to align staffing with peak periods of need.

### **Interession and Spring 2026**

Prior to our winter break, we reviewed opportunities to open up new sections of heavily waitlisted Interession courses. We were able to balance demand with current resources and open up several courses. While we had 2,251 students with an FTES of 284.4 before the break, we now have a headcount of 2,618 and a FTES of 330.5. At the same point last year, our FTES was 321 with a headcount of 2,569, so we do see a small increase this year compared to last year's Interession. Enrollment increased for the Spring 2026 semester as well. Spring 2026 has a headcount of 18,426 and FTES is 5,364. We anticipate seeing continual enrollment over the coming weeks bringing us closer to our enrollment targets.



**We are pleased to announce that Dr. Leticia (“Lety”) López will serve as Dean of Arts and Languages at San Diego Mesa College, effective January 2026.**

Dr. López most recently served for 4.5 years as Dean of Mathematics, Sciences, and Nursing Education at San Diego City College, where she led one of the college’s largest instructional divisions and oversaw \$7 million in unrestricted budgets and \$2 million in grant funding.

A bilingual Cuban and Mexican American scholar, Dr. López began her community college journey as a dual-enrollment student at Los Angeles Pierce College. She earned dual bachelor’s degrees in Biology and Spanish from Mount St. Mary’s College and completed her master’s and doctorate at UC Santa Barbara, with research examining science, literature, and artificial intelligence in Spanish theater.

Dr. López previously served at Mesa College for 15 years as a Professor of Spanish and later as Program Manager for Hispanic-Serving Institution Initiatives, managing more than \$7.5 million in restricted funds. A proud Latina advocate and champion of student success, she enjoys traveling, reading, and spending time with family.

Lacy currently serves as Associate Editor of the *Journal of Communication Pedagogy*.

He has also served as Director of Diversity, Equity, and Belonging at Ivy Tech Community College of Indiana in Lafayette, and as Director of Black Student Success Initiatives at Mt. San Jacinto College District. He is excited to return home to San Diego and join the School of Humanities at San Diego Mesa College!

The Accounts Payable team at the District Office is excited to share that the District is implementing new invoice-processing software to improve efficiency, accuracy, and document security.

Beginning January 12, 2026, Accounts Payable will use a technology, Brainware OCR and Perceptive Content, to electronically capture invoice data and manage supporting documents. This change will significantly reduce manual data entry and streamline invoice processing.

- Invoices must follow the new submission requirements outlined in the attached Accounts Payable Invoice Submission Guidelines

- This process **does not apply** to Payment Requests, Travel, or interface files (e.g., Payroll, Financial Aid, Bookstore)
