### Join SDCCD at the annual San Diego Pride Parade on July 18!

Students, faculty, administrators, and classified professionals from the San Diego Community College District will march under the district banner at the annual San Diego Pride Parade on Saturday, July 18, 2026, one of the largest in the country with up to 100,000 spectators expected. This year's parade theme is "Pride Shines On."

The SDCCD has had a presence in the annual parade since it began more than 40 years ago, but will be the eighth year the district marches together as a contingent. Members of the district's Board of Trustees will take part in the celebration, and representatives from every college – City, Mesa, and Miramar, and the College of Continuing Education – will be there, too.

The parade is set to start at 10 a.m. It follows a 1.5-mile-route beginning at the Hillcrest Pride Flag at University Avenue and Normal Street, continues west on University Avenue, turns south on Sixth Avenue and left onto Balboa Drive and ends at Quince Drive.

Free T-shirts will be provided to the first 300 SDCCD participants. Free shuttle service will run between the Old Naval Hospital, on President's Way and Park Boulevard, to the start of the parade route.

# ENROLLMENT *update*

Summer 2026 FTES is 1,322 and our headcount is 8,047. The Fall 2026 FTES is 4,860 and our headcount is 15,734. For Summer 2026, we are 98.6% towards meeting our goals and anticipate being able to meet our targets even with changes in enrollment and fraudulent "bot" students being removed. As for Fall 2026, the numbers continue to increase, and we have 5.47% more students this week compared to last week.

### News in Financial Aid

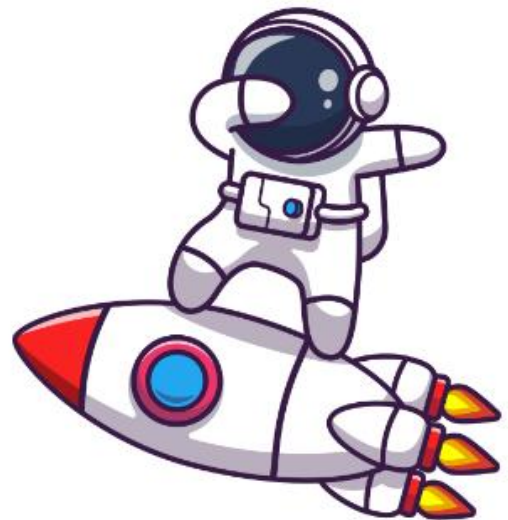

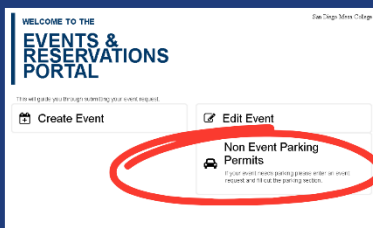

### NON-EVENT PARKING PERMIT REQUEST FORM

NEW!



This form can be used for parking permit requests that are **NOT** related to an event and do not require additional resources or a space/room (i.e. community clinic, meetings in dept. conference rooms, guest speakers during a class, etc.)

- Must be entered two weeks in advance
- Requests require manager approval, similar to Event Requests
- Can be used for single or group permits

Parking related to events will need to be entered as part of an Event Request.

Event Parking:

All parking for events should be included as part of your Event Request in the [Events & Reservation Portal](#). Please keep in mind that all event requests must be submitted at least three weeks before the date of your event (longer for large events). Non-Event Individual/Group Permits:

Requests for non-event parking can be submitted via the [Non Event Parking Permit Request Form](#) now available on our [webpage](#), within the [Events & Reservations Portal](#). These would include requests that are not part of an "event," such as guest speakers, departmental

meeting attendees, etc. that do not require any other support.

The IRB supports the review of research involving human participants and helps promote ethical research practices across the district. This opportunity may be a good fit for faculty with experience or interest in research methods, human subjects research, ethics, program evaluation, or applied inquiry.

Commitment details include:

- 1-year term
- One 1.5-hour meeting per month
- Review of approximately 5-6 proposals per semester
- Onboarding and Human Subjects training required
- No summer meetings
