7. Discussion Items

1. Immigration Enforcement Support/Resource Services Discussion

As a leading college committed to diversity, equity, and inclusion, Mesa College addressed concerns regarding ICE on campus and reaffirmed its dedication to maintaining a safe environment where students can study without fear. District protocols and online resources will be shared, and the Chancellor clarified that students and faculty are not required to cooperate with ICE agents and should redirect any agents to the Chancellor's Office. Student records and citizenship status remain private and protected under college administrative policies. The SDCCDSafe app is available to assist students, including those needing support with transportation, and students traveling with Mesa College who are approached by ICE agents should notify college administration. Students were reminded to know their rights and ask, "Am I being detained?" and "Am I free to leave?" Additional workshops on student rights and campus safety are planned for the near future.

2. Club Funds Matching Request: Society of Women Engineers

A slideshow was shared highlighting a fundraiser held in October that raised \$135, and a request was made for ASG to match these funds. Omar offered to provide club match funding.
